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Yearly Narrative Report (April 2023 - March 2024)



Preamble:

In the gentle embrace of the mid-seventies, NISHTHA emerged as a radiant beacon of hope, a sanctuary of empowerment for the Women and girls of our land. With unwavering dedication, it took upon itself the sacred mission of nurturing awareness of their inherent rights, igniting within them the flame of resilience to stand tall against oppression. From the humble soil of its inception, NISHTHA's roots have spread far and wide, now reaching over 300 villages across five blocks in the District of South 24 Parganas.

At the very core of NISHTHA's existence lie the valiant souls of the Kishori Bahini (Adolescent Groups) and Mahila Mandals (Women's Groups). Drawn from the depths of adversity and injustice, these leaders radiate strength, serving as the sturdy pillars upon which the organization stands. Their tireless advocacy, their relentless pursuit of justice, and their unwavering commitment to the betterment of their communities have woven together the fabric of change, casting ripples of transformation across the villages they touch.

Central to NISHTHA's legacy of impact is the nurturing embrace of the Kishori Bahini, a lifeline extended over decades. These collectives, born out of necessity, stand as bastions of resilience and empowerment, nurturing leaders who rise above the fray with grace and determination. Through the bonds forged within this network of support, NISHTHA envisions a future where every woman and girl stands tall, free from the shackles of violence and discrimination.

Yet, amidst the triumphs, shadows loom over neighboring villages untouched by NISHTHA's compassionate embrace. Recent crises, compounded by the merciless grip of Covid lockdowns and the ravages of cyclones Amphan and Yaas, have plunged these communities into despair. In the face of such adversity, NISHTHA stands resolute, ready to extend its hand of compassion to every corner of West Bengal.

The call to action echoes through the corridors of time, a clarion call to champion the cause of women and girls, to stand as beacons of hope in the darkest of nights. But as despair threatens to engulf us, a ray of light pierces through the gloom. Like a divine blessing from afar, BODHI Australia emerges as a savior in our hour of need.

Swift to grasp the gravity of the situation, BODHI Australia extends its benevolent hand, offering solace to the 200 most vulnerable girls across eleven villages under three blocks. Their support, more than a mere lifeline, is a beacon of hope, a divine light that dispels the darkness from the lives of these innocent souls.

As March unfolds its tender embrace, NISHTHA stands on the precipice of gratitude, completing a year-long collaboration through the Alokita project. The support offered by BODHI Australia transcends mere charity; it is a testament to the power of compassion, a testament to the indomitable spirit of humanity. Through their kindness, 200 precious lives, including 150 secondary and 50 higher secondary girls, find sanctuary and solace, their futures illuminated by the gentle glow of compassion and hope.

Area of Operation:

The project encompasses a total of 11 villages, from Baruipur, Bishnupur – I, and Magrahat - II Community Development Blocks of South 24 Parganas district, West Bengal.

Activities Undertaken:

Distribution of Tuition Fees:

Enabling the pursuit of education, support was extended to 150 secondary level girls, providing them with tuition fees assistance of INR 200 monthly for a duration of 11 months. Additionally, 50 higher secondary girls were aided by covering their tuition fees with INR 300 monthly over the same 11-month period.

Distribution of Hygiene kit:

Here is the list of hygiene items distributed to each girl each month from April 2023 to March 2024:

- Napkin: 12 packets
- Soap: 12 pieces in entire reporting period
- Detergent Powder: 12 packets in entire reporting period



Distribution of Educational Materials:

Educational materials were distributed twice to 200 girls, comprising 5 long exercise books.

Rally:

Throughout the reporting period, Nishtha has been actively engaged in commemorating and advocating for crucial global observances. On 22nd April 2023, on the occasion of World Earth Day, our efforts drew participation from 1565 individuals, reflecting a



shared commitment towards environmental stewardship and sustainability. Subsequently, on 11th October 2023, we celebrated the International Day of the Girl Child, with 1225 participants joining us in championing the rights and empowerment of girls worldwide. A significant milestone was marked on 25th November 2023, as we observed the International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women, with an impressive turnout of 2952 individuals standing in solidarity against gender-based violence and advocating for a safer world for women.

Most recently, on 8th March 2024, we celebrated International Women’s Day, drawing participation from 2688 individuals, as we honored the achievements of women and reaffirmed our commitment to gender equality and women's empowerment. These events have not only served as platforms for awareness and advocacy but have also fostered a sense of community and collective action towards building a more inclusive and equitable society.

Campaigns:

Throughout the reporting period, a total of 18 dynamic campaigns were spearheaded by the girls' groups, in collaboration with the women's groups, marking significant strides towards positive social transformation.

Five small cluster groups of girls were formed who were well-equipped with leaflets, posters and public announcement systems. They created awareness in different road junctures, market places, water points etc. where a large number of people gather. The emphasis was given on ill-effects of child marriages, gender discrimination and violence on women and girls, importance of girls education.



These campaigns stand as testament to the collective strength, resilience, and determination of participants to effect positive change in their communities. Through their unwavering commitment and collaborative efforts, they are driving forward a vision of a more just, equitable, and compassionate society for all.

Stakeholders' Meeting:

During the reporting period, two pivotal stakeholders' meetings convened, uniting key community members in a concerted effort to address the pressing issue of child marriage and foster collaborative solutions.



1. **Meeting** at Andharmanik Gram Panchayat Conference Hall (24 March 2024):

Date: 24 March 2024

Venue: Conference Hall, Andharmanik Gram Panchayat

Participants: Head of Gram Panchayat, (Elected Public Representatives) ASHA/ICDS/ANM Workers, Local Leaders

Objective: The meeting focused on illuminating the detrimental effects of child marriage and elucidating the pivotal role of stakeholders in combating this harmful practice.

Outcome: A total of 80 participants actively engaged in dialogue, exchanging insights and perspectives on the issue. Collaborative strategies were discussed, emphasizing the importance of collective action and community involvement in preventing child marriages.

2. **Meeting** with Elected Public Representatives (26 March 2024):

Date: 26 March 2024

Participants: Elected Public Representatives from 6 Gram Panchayats, ASHA/ICDS Workers, Local Leaders.

Objective: The meeting underscored the imperative of collaborative efforts in eradicating child marriage, rallying elected representatives and community stakeholders to take decisive action.

Outcome: With 35 participants in attendance, including representatives from multiple Gram Panchayats, the meeting fostered a spirit of unity and commitment towards addressing the root causes of child marriage. Participants pledged to work hand-in-hand, leveraging their respective roles and influence to effect meaningful change in their communities.

These stakeholders' meetings served as vital platforms for dialogue, collaboration, and collective problem-solving. By bringing together diverse voices and perspectives, they laid the groundwork for sustained action and collaboration towards creating a safer, more equitable environment for all community members, particularly vulnerable girls at risk of child marriage.

Leadership Building Training for Mother's Group:

On various occasions throughout the early months of 2024, Tongtala Sarada Bhawan played host to a series of enlightening and impactful events. Commencing on the 2nd of January, an insightful session titled "Effective Communication" gathered 30 participants, where leaders and deputy leaders shared their perspectives on tackling this pressing societal issue. Continuing on the 17th of January, another gathering convened, this time focusing on "Importance of Team and Empowering Leaders" With 30 attendees, this session delved into the important roles of the leaders. On the 14th of February, attention turned to "Different types of violence on women and how to protect." where 30 individuals came together to explore comprehensive strategies aimed at combating various forms of violence.



Lastly, on the 18th of February, participants gathered to ponder “Few salient features which are the “must haves” for girl’s life” In this thought-provoking session, attendees engaged in philosophical inquiries alongside discussions on practical applications, all with the aim of gaining deeper insights into the violence prone and descriminative stereotype norms of society. These events not only provided platforms for knowledge exchange but also fostered critical discussions on pertinent societal issues, empowering attendees with the tools and insights needed for positive change.

Leadership Building Training for Girl’s Group:

During the span of late 2023 to early 2024, a series of vital training sessions were conducted for girls' groups, each session accommodating 30 participants. Commencing on the 31st of December 2023, the Sarada Bhawan, Tongtala served as the venue for an enlightening discussion on " Different way to Stop Violence" This session shed light on the crucial issue of violence on women like forced marriages, forced school dropouts and deprived from the source of development, abuse and atrocities. The pivotal role leaders play in addressing such challenges. Continuing this momentum, on the 25th of January 2024, once again at the Sarada Bhawan, Tongtala, and another session delved into "Knowing Yourself" aiming to know her strength and weakness and accordingly prepare herself. Transitioning to the beginning of 2024, where on the 30th of January and then again on the 2nd of February, participants engaged in sessions focusing on “How to prepare realistic planning of group action “and “Creation of group enthusiasm” respectively. These sessions, held at Tongtala Sarada Bhawan, provided a platform for participants to deepen their comprehension of violence and its manifestations, fostering a more

informed and empowered group members ready to address such issues effectively.

One on One Session:

Throughout the duration of this project, a total of 1763 individual counseling sessions and 108 small group sessions were conducted, serving as pivotal interventions. These sessions were particularly instrumental in offering support to adult males who often grappled with heightened distress and frustration due to economic hardships, resulting in conflicts with their partners and daughters.

Training for Community Males:

The individual counseling sessions provided a vital platform for addressing a range of pertinent issues. These discussions encompassed exploring alternative livelihood opportunities, strategies for managing stress and anger constructively, and actively advocating for gender equality within households. Emphasis was placed on encouraging fathers to prioritize their daughters' education and refrain from pressuring them into laborious work. Furthermore, participants were educated about various government initiatives aimed at fostering socioeconomic empowerment.



Through these tailored interventions, a comprehensive approach was adopted to tackle the multifaceted challenges faced by adult males, fostering a greater sense of awareness, resilience, and harmonious relationships within their family.

Home Visits:

Throughout the entirety of this reporting period, a grand total of 2491 home visits were meticulously carried out. These visits proved to be an indispensable avenue for engaging with individuals and families on an intimate level, nurturing trust, empathy, and solidarity. By entering the homes of beneficiaries, project staff gained deeper insights into their specific needs, enabling them to deliver personalized support and guidance tailored to each household's distinct situation. These home visits served as a cornerstone in fortifying the relationship between project facilitators and community members, thereby enhancing the effectiveness and significance of the endeavor.

Informal Session Details:

Informal Session With Girls' and Mothers Groups:

In light of our shared accomplishments, we are reminded of the trials that have punctuated our journey. Recent years have presented us with unprecedented challenges, testing our resilience in profound ways, particularly impacting the well-being of our girls and young women. The lingering effects of these adversities have exacerbated existing vulnerabilities, casting a shadow of concern over our collective efforts.

Amidst these turbulent times, our communities grapple with escalating issues, notably regarding the safety and welfare of our girls and women. Throughout the reporting period, our dedicated social workers convened 14 meetings with mothers'



groups and 21 meetings with girls' groups, providing vital platforms for dialogue and action.

These gatherings served as pivotal forums to address pressing concerns, including the alarming rise in atrocities against girls and women. Instances of trafficking, child and forced marriages, sexual abuse, and exploitation have reached alarming levels, reflecting deeply troubling trends within our communities. Shockingly, over 65 percent of girls were forced to abandon their education post-lockdown, coerced into labor or exposed to illicit activities.



At the heart of these discussions was the crucial role of male members in combating these injustices and fostering a culture of respect and equality within our communities. Through targeted sensitization efforts aimed at heads of families and the broader community, we endeavored to mobilize collective action against these pervasive challenges.

Of particular concern is the emergence of unscrupulous labor suppliers preying on vulnerable girls and their families with false promises of employment. To address this immediate threat, we launched poster campaigns designed to raise awareness within the community. These posters, strategically crafted to caution against deceptive job offers and the dangers of human trafficking, proved to be effective tools for communication, amplifying our efforts to protect vulnerable individuals.

Despite the cacophony of adversity, our determination remains unwavering. It is imperative that we continue to advocate for the rights and protection of our girls and women, ensuring they are empowered to thrive in a safe and supportive environment. Through steadfast commitment and collective action, we can navigate through these tumultuous times, safeguarding the future for generations to come and unlocking the boundless potential that resides within each individual.

Goal:

Empowering 200 Girls across Eleven Villages in South 24 Parganas District, West Bengal, to Ensure Continuance of Education in School and Provide Essential Information, Knowledge, and Training.

Objective vis-à-vis achievement:

1. Ensuring retention of at least 80% of the 200 most Vulnerable Supported Girls Continue their Education until Higher Secondary Level.
2. Protecting at least 80% of the targeted girl children from Child Marriage, Laborer and Trafficking.
3. Formation and strengthening of Girls and Women's group through capacity building training.

Objective: 1

Ensuring retention of at least 80% of the 200 most Vulnerable Supported Girls Continue their Education until Higher Secondary Level

Achievement:

In a resounding testament to our dedication and resilience, the achievements of the project have surpassed expectations despite facing challenging circumstances. The strides made in ensuring girls' education and empowerment stand as shining examples of our unwavering commitment to their futures.

1. Retention in Education: Throughout the reporting period, our relentless efforts bore fruit as a mere 8 out of the 200 supported girls experienced interruptions in their educational journey, resulting in an outstanding retention rate of 96%. Despite adversities, including the disruptions caused by the pandemic and other external factors, our girls have shown remarkable determination to continue their studies, defying odds and embracing the transformative power of education.

2. Board Examination Participation: Demonstrating their dedication and preparedness, more than 90% of the Secondary Board-eligible girls and over 92% of the eligible Higher Secondary girls fearlessly appeared for their respective Board Examinations, conducted by the West Bengal Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Examination. As the results are awaited this June 2024, we anticipate their achievements to mirror their unwavering commitment to academic excellence.

3. Reinstatement of Education beyond Expectations: Remarkably, over 75% of the girls, previously deemed unlikely to complete their formal education, now grace the halls of their schools regularly and have participated in examinations without hindrance. This unforeseen resurgence underscores the transformative impact of our interventions and the unwavering resolve of our beneficiaries to defy societal limitations.

4. Parental Support and Readiness for Sacrifice: Encouragingly, more than 50% of parents have exhibited a profound shift in perspective, prioritizing their daughters' education over potential income. This paradigm shift signifies a fundamental change in attitudes towards gender equality and the recognition of education as a pathway to empowerment.

5. Enhanced Stakeholder Support: Through concerted advocacy efforts, a notable percentage of stakeholders (about 20%) have emerged as staunch supporters of girls' education, displaying increased responsiveness and solidarity. This evolution in mindset not only reinforces our collective commitment to gender equality but also heralds a brighter future where education is recognized as a fundamental right for all.

Amidst the challenges and adversities faced, our journey has witnessed a profound transformation from despair to hope, from servitude to self-confidence. This metamorphosis, indicative of the resilience and fortitude of our community, stands as a testament to the unwavering support and kindness extended by BODHI Australia. Without their generous assistance, our strides toward empowerment and upliftment would not have been possible. Together, we continue to forge ahead, guided by the shared vision of a future where every individual, regardless of gender, is empowered to lead a life of dignity, self-esteem, and boundless opportunity.

Objective: 2

Protecting at least 80% of the targeted girl children from Child Marriage, Laborer and Trafficking

Achievement:

1. Protection from Child Marriage: Through concerted efforts, more than 86 percent of the targeted girls were shielded from the looming threat of child marriage, safeguarding their right to a childhood free from the burdens of premature matrimony. Only four girls got married during this reporting period.

2. Community Commitment to Ending Child Marriage: Encouragingly, 51 targeted families pledged their support towards cultivating a child-marriage-free community, underscoring the collective determination to combat this pervasive issue at its root.

3. Success in Preventing Child Marriage: Despite facing challenges, such as the unfortunate early marriages of 4 out of the 8 dropped-out girls, the resilience of our interventions resulted in the protection of 98 percent of girls from the grips of child marriage, exemplifying the efficacy of proactive measures and community engagement.

4. Awareness Rallies: The relentless advocacy efforts of Alokita project groups manifested in the organization of frequent rallies within the villages, aimed at sensitizing community members to the adverse effects of child marriage and galvanizing collective action towards its eradication. Through these endeavors, hearts and minds were enlightened, paving the way for transformative change.

5. Collaborative Action: In a display of solidarity and determination, women's and girls' groups joined forces to halt the progression of 6 child marriages, demonstrating the power of collective action in safeguarding the rights and dignity of vulnerable individuals.

6. Stakeholder Engagement: Notably, approximately 20% of stakeholders actively contributed to the eradication of child marriage, underscoring the importance of widespread community involvement in effecting meaningful change and fostering a culture of gender equality and empowerment.

These achievements stand as testament to the unwavering dedication and collective resolve of our community partners, stakeholders, and beneficiaries in upholding the rights and dignity of girl children. As we celebrate these milestones, we renew our commitment to tirelessly advocate for the protection of vulnerable girls, ensuring that they are afforded the opportunity to thrive, flourish, and realize their full potential in a safe and nurturing environment.

Objective: 3

Formation and strengthening of Girls and Women's group through capacity building training.

Achievement:

1. Formation of Groups: A total of 24 groups, comprising 12 girls' groups and 12 women's groups, have been successfully established, serving as vibrant hubs of empowerment and collective action within the community.

2. Leadership Development: Each group has diligently selected 12 leaders and 12 deputy leaders, totaling 48 individuals, who have undergone rigorous training and capacity-building exercises. These leaders have emerged as beacons of change, driving forward collective actions and fostering a culture of solidarity and empowerment.

3. Collective Actions: With the guidance of experienced leaders, these groups have initiated five collective actions, with 3 led by girls' collectives and 2 by women's collectives. These initiatives serve as powerful platforms for advocacy, awareness-raising, and community engagement, amplifying the voices of marginalized groups and effecting positive change.

4. Capacity Building Training: A series of eight comprehensive capacity-building training sessions were conducted for each group by dedicated resource persons, equipping participants with essential skills, knowledge, and tools to lead effectively and facilitate meaningful change within their communities.

5. Informal and Small Sessions: In addition to formal training, 21 informal sessions were conducted for the girls and 14 for the mothers, providing opportunities for dialogue, mentorship, and skill-sharing. Furthermore, 385 small sessions were held, engaging both mothers and community males, fostering inclusive participation and collaboration in the pursuit of shared goals.

6. Formal Trainings for Community Adult Males: Recognizing the importance of engaging all segments of society in the pursuit of gender equality, three formal training sessions were conducted specifically for community adult males. These sessions aimed to raise awareness, challenge harmful stereotypes, and promote active participation in efforts to create a more inclusive and equitable community for all.

These achievements underscore the transformative impact of capacity-building initiatives in nurturing leadership, fostering collaboration, and empowering marginalized groups to become agents of change within their communities. As we celebrate these milestones, we reaffirm our commitment to continue supporting and strengthening these groups, ensuring that they remain catalysts for positive social transformation and champions of gender equality and empowerment.

Case Study:



In the heart of Kholshemari village resides a young woman, a shining example of resilience and hope. Despite facing early adversity, she found herself under the nurturing wings of Alokita, a transformative project empowering young girls to chart their own destinies. Raised by her mother, who toiled tirelessly as a maid to sustain their small family, the young woman's upbringing was marked by hardship. The untimely loss of her father left them with little means to thrive.

The young woman's mother's meager earnings were insufficient for their needs, forcing the early marriage of this young woman's elder sister, who bore the brunt of domestic responsibilities and violence at a tender age. Witnessing her

sister's plight, the young woman harbored fears of a similar fate. Yet, fate intervened through the compassionate intervention of Nishtha's social workers.

Despite initial resistance from her mother, the promise of Alokita's support and BODHI Australia's sponsorship ignited a glimmer of hope. Tears of joy welled in the young woman's mother's eyes as she envisioned a brighter future for her daughter. The young woman, once resigned to her circumstances, found herself back in the classroom, eager to pursue her education.



With each academic milestone, this young woman defied expectations, fueled by the unwavering support of the Nishtha team and the generosity of BODHI Australia. As she progresses from class to class, her dreams expand, transcending the limitations of her past.



From the depths of poverty emerged a beacon of transformation, embodied by this young woman's journey. Her aspirations, once stifled by circumstance, now soar boundlessly. With determination and resilience, she envisions not only completing her education but also shouldering the responsibility of her family's future.
